

Plan of events:

<u>Friday</u> –Upon arrival and check in to (A) your hotel please come by the group camping spot

at the **(B)** James M. Robb State Park (there will be a \$6 entrance fee) for the BBQ. Please be courteous to our fellow guests at the park. Feel free to swing by **(C)** Jackalope Liquor and bring some beverages to the BBQ.

Upon arrival to the BBQ, please see Sleepin or Val to collect your shirts and make sure everything is square with your registration. The BBQ and Lawn Chair Racing will be welcome until the park's quiet time of 10PM.



<u>Saturday</u> –The morning events will commence at **9:14 AM** in the parking lot of the Dinosaur Museum (on the East side of 340 right next to McDonalds). The drive will be an estimated 140 miles round trip. We will try to space out a couple of the local participants within the lineup to avoid getting split up. <u>Please ensure you have enough fuel! Fuel stops are limited for the day's drive. There is a gas station at the Resort in Gateway. We will meet up and head South down 340 to the Colorado National Monument gate. There will be a \$7 entrance fee to enter, so please have cash handy.</u>

Once inside the Monument there will be several pull outs that we will stop at for photos. Please note that the drive through the Monument can be dangerous if not paying attention, so please drive responsibly.


When we are done with the Monument, and through the exit gate, we will pause to get gathered back up. There will be a few turns on the outskirts of town to get to the highway.



Once through town, we will travel South / East on Highway 50 to Highway 141. Once on 141, we will make the run all the way down into Gateway. Highway 141, does not turn off or branch off, so if you fall behind no worries. Once into the town of Gateway (don't blink) you will come down a hill with a 90 degree left turn. Just after the left, on the right hand side is the Gateway Resort.
